





Nine Principles of Heritage Education and Learning

- 1. Enjoyment is the key.
- 2. People never forget things that they have touched.
- 3. What is good for children is also good for adults. (This rule seldom applies in reverse).
- 4. People protect things they have a relationship with.
- 5. Heritage sites are places where we can discover our own stories.
- 6. Castles and Chateaux are not the only historic environments.
- 7. Heritage sites provide an opportunity for all generations to meet, learn, create and have fun.
- 8. The process is just as important as the result.
- 9. Help me to comprehend things by myself.
